## POST-OPERATIVE INSTRUCTIONS: ARTHROSCOPIC KNEE SURGERY

## 1. GENERAL:

- Drink plenty of fluids
- Resume diet as tolerated
- Some swelling is normal after surgery
  - o To reduce swelling, <u>ELEVATE</u> your leg on 2-3 pillows while you sleep for the first two or three nights. Elevate your leg above heart level for at least 30 minutes/3-4 times per day.
  - PLACE PILLOW UNDER CALF OR ANKLE, NEVER UNDER KNEE.
- Wear cryocuff for first 48 hours, except while exercising, then use ice as needed for pain.
- Take an over the counter stool softener/laxative to avoid constipation (e.g. senna-s, pericolace)

## 2. INCISIONAL CARE:

- May remove dressing after 72 hours. Keep incisions clean and dry.
- Do not wash incisions or apply ointment or creams.
- · May place clean DRY band-aids over incisions
- If you have any Steri-strips on your incisions, do not remove
- You may shower after 3 days but do not scrub over incisions. Pat dry. NO IMMERSION OF OPERATIVE KNEE (i.e bath, hot tub, pool, etc)
- No tub baths or swimming until instructed by the doctor.

3.	ACTIVITY:  Exercises begin the day of surgery 3 times per day for 30 minutes, unless directed otherwise.  Nerve blocks may temporarily limit your ability to do exercises. Do what you are able.  Heel slides  Ankle pump  Straight leg raise  Quad sets  You will be given instructions for weight bearing upon discharge from the hospital. Use two crutches at all times for 24 hours, until nerve block wears off, unless instructed otherwise.  weight bearing with brace

	<ul><li>Norco 5/325 mg</li><li>→ 1 pill every 4-6 hours as needed for pain</li></ul>
	<ul> <li>Zofran 4 mg (This medication is expensive: Only fill prescription if experiencing nausea)</li> <li>→ 1 pill every 8 hours as needed for nausea/vomiting</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Colace 100 mg (No prescription needed)</li> <li>→ 1 pill by mouth 2 times daily as needed to prevent constipation</li> </ul>

	•	Over-the-counter:
		<ul> <li>Tylenol Extra Strength</li> <li>Norco contains Tylenol, if you are taking NORCO do not take additional Tylenol</li> <li>1-2 pills every 6 hours as needed for pain</li> <li>** Do not exceed 4000 mg of Acetaminophen/Tylenol in 24 hrs</li> </ul>
		☐ Ibuprofen 200 mg (Motrin, Advil) - 2-4 pills every 8 hours as needed for pain
		Colace 100 mg: 1 pill every 12 hours as needed for constipation
	•	Take pain medication with food when possible.  Do not take Ibuprofen if taking a blood thinner such as Lovenox or Coumadin.  Do not take Ibuprofen if you are intolerant of other NSAIDS.  Do not take Tylenol or Ibuprofen if you have kidney or liver disease.
